




PROVIDING INTERNET ACCESS

ANYTIME, ANYWHERE


About 14% of Evanston residents have no access to the internet at home. In 2017, 353 people brought home the internet for free for a month with a WiFi Hotspot: to **cruise the internet**, to look for jobs, to work, to do school projects, to learn.

WiFi Hotspots circulated 786 times in 2017 from the Evanston Public Library and through our pilot locations at ETHS and Lincoln Elementary School. Demand exceeds supply.

EARLY LITERACY PROGRAMS

GUIDED BY BEST PRACTICES.

Early experiences with books and stories correlate to future achievement. Together, parents, caregivers, teachers, and librarians can develop more literate children. Literacy development starts at birth.

FIVE SIMPLE STEPS SUPPORT EARLY LITERACY:

SOCIAL WORK SERVICES:

A NEW PATH TO INFORMATION AND RESOURCES

In 2017, EPL, in a partnership between the City of Evanston and Presence Behavioral Health, became one of just a few libraries nationwide with an onsite social worker. Patrons receive resource information, direct support, and are helped to find necessary services ranging from primary care, mental health care, housing, and employment.




